1. IPCC Library and Research Helpdesk

UN Environment manages the IPCC Library Facility and Helpdesk.

All IPCC AR6 Authors are eligible to use the service, which gives access to the latest scientific research and journals.

Because access is IP-based, it will not be possible to provide direct access to paid subscriptions, except through the helpdesk. Our trained librarians will be able to provide you with full-text articles in record time.

The Helpdesk will respond to queries within a maximum of two working days.

2. Standard Operating Procedures

- Provide details of the resources you need to access, including: title, author, journal, year of issued, and URL, if known.
- If you want a search performed on specific topics/keywords, indicate the keywords. The Helpdesk will share a list of relevant titles and abstracts. Full-text articles will be provided upon confirmation of the selected titles.
- Authors are requested to sign their emails with their full names, role, and chapters they are working on.

OARE is a Research for Life (R4L) partnership, designed to provide free or low cost peer-reviewed content to eligible academic, government and research institutions in the developing world. An institute can register to more than one service. The partnership is made up of:

- Access to Global Online Research in Agriculture (AGORA) – FAO
- Access to Research in Health (HINARI) – WHO
- Access to Research for Development and Innovation (ARDI) – WIPO
